

NEW YORK TAXI (2021-ongoing)

Steel, aluminum, car parts, $500 \times 190 \times 160$ cm

From Rotterdam to New York: Rowan van As has built a fully functional replica of a 1960–90s New York taxi from steel and aluminum. The plan is to take it across the Atlantic as a moving stage for stories and music, leading to a film inspired by *Space is the Place, Taxi Driver*, and *Night on Earth*.

Dizzy's Trumpet (2022) Large-scale tribute to Dizzy Gillespie's iconic bent trumpet.

DIZZY'S TRUMPET (2022)

Foam, PVC, discarded cooking oil cans, $250 \times 150 \times 100$ cm

A large-scale tribute to Dizzy Gillespie's legendary bent trumpet, recreated in foam, PVC, and metal from discarded cooking oil cans. A playful homage to jazz history and the multicultural spirit of Rotterdam.

East Village View Fruit Exchange (2017) Installation inspired by a found photo of an old New York deli & fruit store.

EAST VILLAGE VIEW FRUIT EXCHANGE (2017)

Wood, cardboard, real fruit, 300 × 250 × 200 cm

An installation based on a found photo of an old New York deli and fruit store, built from wood, cardboard, and real fruit. Characters like the Newspaper Boy and the Ultra-Orthodox Jew appeared during the live show, playfully comparing Antwerp to New York. Afterward, all the fruit was given away, returning the project's budget to the city.













ANTWERP CITY YOUR SO PRITTY (2015)

Foam, wood, acrylic resin, musical instruments, $150 \times 100 \text{ cm} \times 60 \text{ cm}$

A street performance in Antwerp with a mussel-shaped piano playing Antwerp City, a song about beauty and decay. Inspired by Istanbul's mussel vendors and my Zeeland roots, a region famed for mussels, the work brought music to city crossroads amid passing cars.







SCREAMING SEAGULLS (2013)

Found objects, recliner chair, acrylic on wood panel, $200 \times 120 \times 60$ cm

A worn 1990s recliner with a decaying base that screeched like seagulls inspired a painted childhood beach memory, linked to the chair in a playful audiovisual assemblage.
